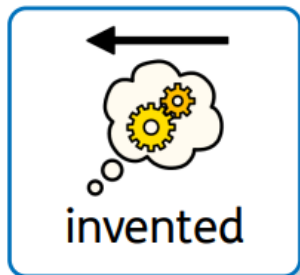
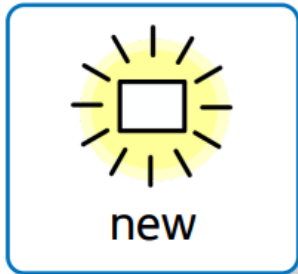
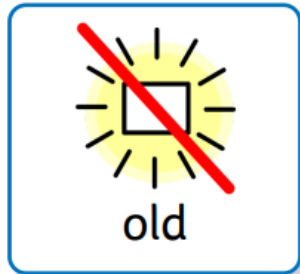
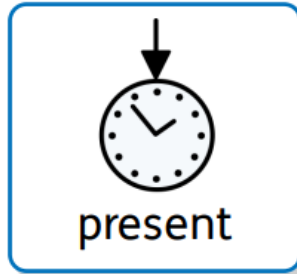
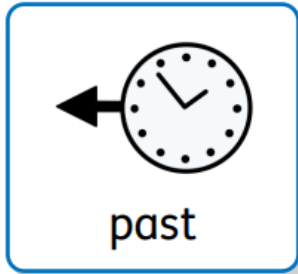




This unit builds on your learning in Foundation and will build towards your learning in Year 3, when you learn about and compare different aspects of Victorian and modern day life in 'The Victorian'
